While Section 4(1) (a) provides a general guideline for record management, so that the information could be easily stored and retained, the subsections b, c and d of Section 4 relate to the organisational objects and functions. Sub-sections (b), (c) and (d) of Section 4 of the RTI Act and other related information can be grouped under six categories; namely, 1-organisation and function, 2- Budget and programmes, 3- Publicity and public interface, 4-E. governance, 5-Information as prescribed and 6. Information disclosed on own initiative.
